

Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for June (Linda Mueller): The June Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Budget Analysis, and the Stewardship Report reviewed.

Total Income: \$6,213.00. Total expense: \$10,115.92. Net Income: **MINUS** \$3,902.92.

Building Improvement Fund: \$40,462.83. Parsonage Fund: \$28,486.12. General Fund: MINUS \$8,593.07.

Memorial Fund: \$95,833.70. Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$17,969.28.

Daniel Van Straten moved to accept the treasurer's report as received, Sarah Kolb seconded. Passed.

- The feasibility of comparing treasurer's reports of the current year with the previous year under review.

Head Trustee Report (Jay Englebert & Mason White):

- Big snow blower to be delivered to Feldmann's for maintenance in mid-September to avoid delays.
- Resurfacing and restriping of both parking lots completed, but some repair remains yet on the west lot.

Board of Christian Education Report (Lisa McKenzie):

- Vacation Bible School (VBS) is going well.
- The Sunday School curriculum for the church year (September, 2016 May, 2017) is set and ready to go.

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- The new computers for the Pastor's Office and the Church Office purchased and installed.
- We'll keep the ad in the **Sheboygan County Business Guide**.
- Shepherd's Staff (computer program): Database has no support provided and has been out of support for several years. Noticeable discrepancies in statistics and missing information. Jeremy is researching databases.
- Canvassing members on active and inactive status for inclusion in the new church directory.
- We'll carry on partnering and supporting Sheboygan County Interfaith Organization (SCIO). Mary Circle of the Women's Guild makes donations to SCIO's Bridgeway.
- Marketing: New logo and letterhead developed by Joanne Lensink now in use.
- Mission statement: Attempting to share a new mission statement with the Congregation by September emphasizing "who we are."

President's Report (Richard Reineking):

- The cost for the dumpster includes rental plus weight. Only old roofing items are allowed to be disposed of in the dumpster; any other type of refuse put in the dumpster needs to be removed before pickup.
- Fence at the west end of west parking lot: Remove the fence. If any problems result from the fence removal, a new fence is to be installed.

Other Business:

- We may need a lock on our dumpster to prevent other people from depositing refuse in it.
- Pledge tracking: We need to distribute Statements of Giving quarterly.
- Piano tuning: Needs to be done on the piano used for musical performance in the sanctuary.
- Leaking in the basement under review.
- Experimenting with a new procedure in ushering. Ushers to greet people and hand out bulletins. Consistory members to do the collection.


