

Why do you look for the living among the dead? What a question to be asked. How do you answer this? The angels in the Gospel of Luke ask a tough question. So where do you look for the risen Christ?

This month we will celebrate Holy Week as we wind down our Lenten journey. On April 9, we will celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem as the people shout Hosanna and lay coats and palms to honor the King of Peace. We celebrate with Dylan Timm and Alex Holland as they confirm their faith and claim this journey of faith as their own. As the children wave their palms and two young men claim their faith, we remember the joy of being followers of Christ.

But it takes a turn to a darker side of our faith come Maundy Thursday. We remember with heavy hearts the last meal Jesus shared with his closest friends. We share in that sacred meal and listen to the stories that lead to the final hours of Jesus life on Earth. We are overwhelmed by the darkness that binds our joy with heavy chains—even though we know that the joy of resurrection will come soon.

We move into Good Friday (or more accurately God's Friday). I invite you to come and share in this time of worship April 14 at Ebenezer U.C.C. at 7pm. On that Friday, we sit in the depths of despair as we remember the brutality of Rome and consequently the crucifixion of one who was a champion of forgiveness and love and compassion. We sink further into the darkness and recognize our own mortality and fragility.

And then we spend a day waiting. A day where we know what happens next, but still we wait with baited breath. During that Holy Saturday we wait in subdued vigil for the risen Christ.

And finally we celebrate Easter—a commemoration of the empty tomb and the risen Christ. We sing songs about walking in the garden or that He is risen or about the resurrection. We wear our Sunday best. We have elaborate dinners with family and friends. We hide eggs and munch on chocolate. And oh how sweet it is to hear those words: *He is not here, but has risen*.

So where do you see that risen Christ in your life? Where do you find that overwhelming joy that swallows darkness? Where do you find that place that says that Love Wins no matter what?

Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for February (Linda Mueller): Linda reviewed the reports.

 must at least in the meantime have the change signed and notarized. Motion passed to accept the Treasurer's
 Report as received and proceed with getting the Land Contract change signed and notarized.
- Office Supplies expense increased (included: website hosting, church directory expense, computers expense).
 A separate Computer Expense account will be added.
- Investment objectives (Conservative Growth and American Funds management) discussion tabled until May.

Head Trustee Report (Mason White):

- Faulty exterior lighting is being checked.
- Brick work at the digital message board site in progress. Old bricks will be set aside for members to take.
- The downspout in the Memorial Garden is fixed.
- Failed on a recent fire inspection because emergency alarms didn't illuminate, but the problem is now fixed.
- Three Sunday school rooms painted.

Board of Christian Education Report (Jaymz Stempihar):

- Saturday evening movie night in February went well.
- Tentative plans are being made for upcoming events, like a pizza sale fundraiser, Sunday school Easter breakfast (April 16), and a carnival (June 11).

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- New paraments ordered for the Advent season and a new Christ candle, both paid for with memorial funds.
 A new candle lighter purchased.
- Northeast Association meeting scheduled at Ripon on April 22, and Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting at Green Lake Conference Center, June 8-11. Jeremy is a delegate to General Synod meeting in July.

- A Money for Missions program that donates money to churches to be used for fundraising and missions is being researched.
- Curtains and chalk boards removed in a Sunday school room, and white boards to be installed.
