

I had the pleasure to represent St. Paul's U.C.C. at the Annual Meeting of the Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ June 8-10. While I acknowledge that I am a bit of a church meeting nerd, multi-day meetings can wear you down quickly. Between the pre-meeting, boundary training, the annual meeting itself, coming home early for celebrating graduation and the neighborhood carnival, and then a wonderful gathering and celebration of Ivy's life, I was a bit exhausted the following Monday.

I would like to tell you a bit about the Annual Meeting because it is such a wonderful celebration of what is happening in the churches of the Wisconsin Conference. So here are a few take-aways that I gleaned from my time in Green Lake.

First-at the pre-meeting workshop we talked a lot about asset based church leadership. In other words, we need to quit resting on what we were and the resources we wish we had, and celebrate the resources of time, talent, our building, and our unique location in Sheboygan and work from what we do have and how we might minister to our neighborhood more fully.

Second- As I listened to our General Minister and President of the U.C.C. the Rev. Dr. John Dorhauer, I was struck by his optimism about how our particular understanding of faith is essential. He asked the question: what aspect of the gospel do we lift up, that would diminish us without it? In other words, if we ceased to exist, what part of Jesus's Gospel message would vanish. We are important and essential in the work of God's kingdom because of who and where we are. Rev. Dorhauer also asked the question: "What does it look like to recreate the image of God in our particular context so that, in the words of Paul, we are "showing no partiality." In other words, one of our jobs is to let people know, as we say "Come as you are. You are welcome here."

Third- Our Wisconsin Conference Minister, the Rev. Franz Rigert, spoke about his confidence and joy in working with and for the Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ. He challenged us with a new concept—one of "Traditioned Innovation." In other words, how do we take the best of our traditions, build on them, and make new traditions rooted in our heritage. This concept has been on my mind a lot as our Five Practices Group continues its work in thinking deeply about what, why, and how we proclaim the Gospel message of love and forgiveness to our community.

Fourth- We had privilege of hearing from the Honorable Rev. Everett Mitchell, who is both the lead pastor at Christ the Solid Rock Baptist church in Madison and a Dane County Circuit court judge. We heard his fascinating story about how his church came to be and what they have had to do to make it work for everyone. He focused on his theory of "just one thing" or making sure all that you do has a specific element that is core to your being. For Rev. Mitchell, he focuses his being on all things revolving around relationship. If there is no relationship to be formed or enriched, he passes on the activity. What might it look like if we as a church made sure everything that we did had a common thread? His sharing about how their little church has enriched the neighborhood surrounding them stood out to me because they took what they had and created partnerships to share the love of God with everyone.

Fifth and finally- Much of the conversations, preaching, speaking, and presentations help up the idea that if our distinct sharing of the Gospel message is going to survive, we must, must, must be more collaborative and innovative on how and where we proclaim the kingdom of God, for the expressed purpose of inviting all willing people in the greater story of God's redeeming love. I hope you can take some time this summer to really begin to think about who we are and who we are becoming as St. Paul's U.C.C. I hope you know that our best days are not behind us, but we are walking boldly in faith on the path that God has set before us. Because we are God's children, holy and beloved, our church and each one of you matters deeply, not just to God, but to our little corner of the world here on the south side of Sheboygan.

Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for May (Linda Mueller): Linda reviewed the reports.

Total Income: \$15,364. Total expense: \$8,517. Net Income: \$6,846. Building Improvement Fund: \$30,945. Parsonage Fund: \$26,119. General Fund: \$-4,902. Memorial Fund Savings Account: \$70,885.

Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$27,504. Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$15,076.

- The General Fund deficit reduced by \$7,558 because the net income showed an amount of \$6,846 and weekly giving totals increased by \$5,897.

 attendance was a little less because it was held after Sunday school classes and some
 local school sessions had ended.
- Vacation Bible School (VBS) for this year cancelled.
- Movie night on August 2 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m., with kids drop off.

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- Summer worship at Sheboygan's Veteran's Park on July 23.
- Summer series on the "symbols of our faith" on the stained glass windows in the sanctuary. No children's sermons in the summer.
- Pastor Jeremy is a delegate to General Synod meeting in July.

President's Report (Richard Reineking):

 Richard said RLO Signs undergoing staff changes. Meanwhile, a delay in work on the signage inside the building, but Joanne Lensink volunteered to help out with this work. A new RLO Signs staff person will be in charge of maintenance of the digital sign board outside the church.

Other Business:

 Linda Mueller reviewed the membership directory with Consistory members. Some more entries in the membership directory were removed from the list and relocated to inactive status.
