

God's grace and peace to you! I have been thoroughly enjoying spring, now that it is finally here. I am excited for this summer here at St. Paul's. Included in this beacon, you will find calendars for the summer months. We will be celebrating our life together by sharing in some special fellowship and worshipping in Evergreen park too. We will have some Sundays for kids this summer where the good folks from the Christian Education board will be working on some special fun for the kids. As summer is often a time for vacations and relaxing, I encourage you to take some time to spend with your family and make some lasting memories. I hope that when you are in town that you will join with your faith family for some worship and fellowship.

On May 22, we had our end of Sunday School celebration after worship. I cannot tell you how proud I was of how well our carnival went. The Christian Education board and all of the amazing helpers made our church a welcoming place for 79 kids (more than half from the neighborhood around us and close to 100 adults. I was dunked so many times, I lost count. What a wonderful gift to our community and what a way to share the love of God with our neighbors.

Over the past few weeks, I've asked you a number of questions. I have appreciated your responses and I would like to share in summary (but on the next page, in whole) our congregation's thoughts. First and foremost, what shone through in our congregational DNA was the welcoming nature of St. Paul's. A majority of people described our faith family as loving, friendly, kind, and compassionate. I read about how St. Paul's was a family that cared for one another, that this place was safe for people to be who they are, regardless of where they are on their faith journey. I read about how St. Paul's is a place that helps people outside of this building (and that we needed to be more intentional about doing more). I read about about the well-loved traditions of the candle light Christmas Eve worship and of the Last Supper production (happening Lent 2017). I read about how important the music in this place is for worship.

I want to thank everyone for helping me get a better understanding of St. Paul's. The consistory and the newly formed marketing committee will be working together on putting out some ideas of a mission/vision/purpose statement for everyone to ponder. Part of our process before we begin to reach out in the community more is to be sure to know who we are inviting people to be a part of. Through all of your participation, I think we have a good starting place. If you would like to share further with me information that you feel is important for me to know, please get in touch with me so we can set up some time to chat.

While all of this is happening, the Christian Education board and the Sunday school teachers are looking at new Sunday school curriculums for the fall. As we move forward on this, we all felt it was important that the kids and the adults were sharing the same text on Sundays. Regardless of the choice of curriculum, I will be preaching on the same text as the Sunday school will be learning about. I am very excited to have all of us sharing the same stories so that we can move in faith together.

In that same vein, I very much miss spending time in study and teaching. To that end, I am hoping that we can begin thinking about how we can engage adults in study. I am hoping that we might have a few Sunday morning classes this summer, with the goal of finding times to share in study together by fall. If you are interested, please let me know!

Present: Jeremy Hylen (Pastor), John Brown, Jay Englebert, Charlotte Jump, Leon Jump, Mike King, Lisa McKenzie, Linda Mueller, Richard Reineking, Daniel Van Straten, Mason White **Absent:** Sarah Kolb, Jaymz Stempihar **Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for April (Linda Mueller):**

Total Income: \$7,507.00. Total expense: \$8,052.31. Net Income: \$(-545.31). Building Improvement Fund: \$41,278.78. Parsonage Fund: \$26,800.12. General Fund: \$(-3,886.15). Memorial Fund: \$95,824.09. Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$17,969.28. The Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$7,286.00.

Head Trustee Report (Jay Englebert & Mason White):

- The garage roof shingles repair to be done by 12 Sheboygan Falls High School students under the supervision of their teacher, costing an estimated \$1,500 \$2,000 for materials. Work completed by October 1.
- The bushes at the west end of the parking lot facing Wedemeyer Street to be removed, cut flush.
- Resurfacing and restriping the large parking lot work in progress.
- The condition of the fence at the west end of small parking lot needs to be resolved.
- A "little library" to be placed on church grounds near the side walk.

Board of Christian Education Report (Lisa McKenzie):

- New curriculum to connect Scripture passages readings to class work.
- Technology Grant \$1,000 received is enough to cover one computer. Motion passed to purchase one computer for the Pastor and one for Admin. Asst. Lisa Drews.
- Carnival at the end of Sunday School on Sunday, May 22.
- Second Saturday movie night on June 11.
- Graduation Sunday at St. Paul's on June 12.

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- Jeremy presented the survey results for the questions asked of church members attending worship.
- Jeremy passed out a sheet titled "What does it take to run the church?" on how the budget is spent, why money is needed, how much the church spends on each member, and average weekly giving percentages.
- Jeremy is attending the Wisconsin Conference UCC Annual Meeting at Green Lake on June 9-11.

President's Report (Richard Reineking):

- Otis needs to fix the phone in the elevator for outgoing emergency calling.
- Richard shared a letter from custodian Carol Reineking expressing satisfaction with the purchase of the new vacuum by Vickie King.
- The review of the leaking problem from the flat rubber roof (over the Gathering Room) indicated major heat loss and an ice jam at least two feet high. It needs replacing, and an estimate from the Duro-Last firm estimates the cost at \$11,000. Vents to be installed up along the roof line to cool it down. Motion passed to replace the rubber roof. [Projects costing more than \$10,000 need to be approved by the Congregation.]
- Ross Beimling will replace the overhead door and improve the opening mechanism.

Other Business:

- A new wish list is needed for memorials. Members need ideas of what things to donate.
- The message board on the church grounds needs to be improved. Estimated to cost \$10,000. Motion passed to purchase a new digital sign. [Projects costing more than \$10,000 need to be approved by the Congregation.]
- A security camera is needed at the entrance door off the alley. A camera costing approx. \$100 will be accessible to a cell phone. Motion passed to purchase and install the camera.




