

Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for September (Linda Mueller):

Total Income: \$8,612.95. Total expense: \$10,101.81. Net Income: **MINUS** \$(1,488.86). Building Improvement Fund: \$37,282.83. Parsonage Fund: \$31,015.12. General Fund: **MINUS** \$(14,178.39). Memorial Fund: \$95,848.19. Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$17,969.28. The Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$7,812.00.

- The Second Mile fund for 2016 made available for additional donations to offset our deficit.
- The church building insurance by Hanover Insurance Co. due for review by the beginning of 2017. John Brown bidding out for three more estimates, including reviewing UCC insurance.
- No documentation or notarization received for the Land Contract negotiated 10 months ago. Further contact happening to ensure up-to-date efficient documentation.

Head Trustee Report (Jay Englebert & Mason White):

- Garage roof is being repaired October 17 & 24 by Sheboygan Falls Construction Class.
- Removing some stumps, bushes, and trees on church grounds.

Board of Christian Education Report (Lisa McKenzie):

- Christmas Program practices after the Children's Message each Sunday until December 4.
- Volunteers needed for Kiddie Keep and Sunday School Shepherd Program.
- Advertising church events on the church website (<u>www.sspucc.org</u>) and on Facebook.

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- The Music Committee recommended hiring Lisa Flook as the new organist. A motion to hire Lisa Flook for the organist position passed.
- A coalition of churches, including St. Paul's, helping to run a warming shelter at Salvation Army during the cold months (December to February). Helping to care for people needing to keep warm in the community.
- More support needs to be given to the UCC Mission *Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) Basic Support*, and it needs to be made a budgeted line item. The four *OCWM Special Support* missions (Neighbors in Need, the Christmas Fund, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), and Strengthen the Church), covered by *OCWM Basic Support*, will be put on hold for the time being.
- The UCC Sheboygan churches are combining resources and working together. The UCC Golf Out ing at Riverdale in October had a nice turnout.

President's Report (Richard Reineking):

A second bid on the digital message board received from Marshall Signs. The flag poles located on each side of the message board need to be removed and disposed of. The colored flags formerly attached to those poles deteriorated fast and won't serve a purpose once the new digital colored message board is installed.


