

### Consistory Meeting Minutes - St. Paul's UCC, Sheboygan, WI Wednesday, October 11, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

**Present:** Jeremy Hylen (Pastor), John Brown, Charlotte Jump, Leon Jump, Mike King, Joanne Lensink, Richard Reineking, Daniel Van Straten, and Mason White. **Absent:** Linda Mueller, Donna Rautmann, and Jaymz Stempihar.

#### Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for September (Linda Mueller):

Total Income: \$8,097. Total expense: \$10,743. Net Income: \$-2,646. Building Improvement Fund: \$32,225. Parsonage Fund: \$29,491. General Fund: \$-9,917.

Memorial Fund Savings Account: \$69,899, plus Total Memorial Monies: \$757.

Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$26,072. Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$8,029.

#### **Head Trustee Report (Mason White):**

- Furnace filters replaced.
- Good record keeping is necessary for all maintenance work performed.
- Pews at the front area of the sanctuary have been removed to make room for hand bell tables. Carpet pieces will be added to the bare tile areas.

#### Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

- Five Practices group focusing on survey of church members with help from the Confirmation class.
- Refinishing work on the cabinet in the Music Room is completed.

#### President's Report (Richard Reineking):

- Elevator maintenance costs are going to be less because of a 30% discount for limited.
- The furnaces will be repaired by a church member, reducing furnace expense at this time. Replacing the furnaces is being delayed for now.
- A total quote of \$1,300 for carpet cleaning in the Sanctuary, Gathering Area, Fellowship Hall, and Community Room was discussed. Cleaning in these areas has been delayed for a few years. Motion to approve the quote and clean the carpeting upstairs this year and downstairs before Easter.

#### **Other Business:**

- Dedication of the new digital sign board to take place at the end of October.
- The pews removed from the sanctuary are being offered to church members, and any remaining removed from the church premises.
- A bid from Ecomanity for electrical lighting savings was turned down.
- New signage within the church building is in the finishing stages.
- Different pledge forms and time and talents forms used during this year's stewardship drive. The time and talents list will be more general. Consistory members will canvas church members on what they want to do.
