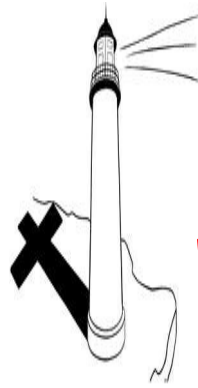

# Pastor's Page

The 5 Practices group has been meeting for several months, wrestling with a lot of big concepts about how we serve God with and through our congregation and our church building. Here are some key learnings we have found. First, worship is our main point of contact for the congregation and visitors. Second, St. Paul's is already engaged in many mission opportunities (many around children/youth). Third, we could do a better job of keeping people aware of what all is happening. Fourth, we have to be more intentional and accessible to our congregation (and neighbors) so that everyone has the opportunity to serve at some level. And finally we have wrestled with this big question: In the face of changing cultural values and busy schedules, how does the church adapt to meet the needs of its members and those outside our walls?

In light of all of this, we present to you our further questions and areas we are still wrestling with. We would love your thoughts and ideas. So email or talk to anyone in the working group. Those brave souls are Richard Reineking, John Brown, Barb Hengst, Joanne Lensink, Steve Flook, and Pastor Jeremy.

## **Some areas we are currently working on and talking about**

fresh coats of paint in the Sunday school classrooms, sanctuary, community room, and garage.  
updating landscaping and the courtyard  
better signage for the interior of the church  
examine and redesign communication methods (pew card, bulletin, beacon)  
remodel/modify the gathering area to be more inviting  
creation of specific visitor point of entry area  
begin reviewing sound system (system was last updated in 1991)  
look at the lighting in the sanctuary

### Intentional Faith Development

How do we deepen relationships in the church for all its members?  
Are there small group opportunities for all people in the church?  
How do we foster faith outside of worship?  
What are ways we might explore cross-generational experiences?

What might we gain by adding greeters?

### Risk-taking Mission and Service

**Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for April (Linda Mueller):** Linda reviewed the reports.

Total Income: \$11,453. Total expense: \$9,367. Net Income: \$2,086. Building Improvement Fund: \$30,408.

Parsonage Fund: \$25,276. General Fund: \$-12,460. Memorial Fund Savings Account: \$95,876.

Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$27,504. Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$9,179.

- The General Fund deficit reduced by \$2,045 because the net income showed an amount of \$2,086 and weekly giving totals increased by \$2,106.
- Earnings from the brat fry at Miesfelds on April 22 amounted to \$997.

**Head Trustee Report (Mason White):**

- Work on the grounds to include new plantings and mulch, focusing on plants that grow well in the shade.

**Board of Christian Education Report (Jaymz Stempihar):**

- Vacation Bible School (VBS) Survey to parents. Instructions for using the dishwasher in the kitchen to be videotaped.

**Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hulen):**

- Summer worship at Sheboygan's Veteran's Park on July 23.
- Summer series on the "symbols of our faith" on the stained glass windows in the sanctuary.
- "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations" group study at St. Paul's is focusing on communication and getting information to the congregation on strengthening ministries, working on building on what we do.
- Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting at Green Lake Conference Center, June 8-11. Jeremy is a delegate to General Synod meeting in July.
- Making the Memorial Garden anew. Discussion on funding the project. Motion to provide up to \$1,500 for the development of the Memorial Garden seconded and passed.
- Planting flowers around the new digital sign board and vicinity.

**President's Report (Richard Reineking):**

- Richard said RLO Signs visited the church site and reviewed the rooms and halls for signage compliance. The name Kiddie Keep for signage is changing to Nursery, and Friendship Hall renamed Fellowship Hall.
- Reviewing fire alarms for compliance.



**Other Business:**

- A request made of the Endowment Committee to cover a Last Supper Dramatization expense of \$499 from the Endowment Fund approved.
- The hand bells need to be refurbished. Hand Bell Director Pat Jaberg is reviewing firms doing refurbishing. The hand bell tables are in poor condition (loose nuts and bolts). John Brown and Richard Reineking will attempt to repair the tables.
- Discussion on WELCOME signage "invitation to church".
- Emmaus Meals on June 17 at Salvation Army from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.
- Brat fry fundraiser on August 5 at Miesfelds from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- Thank you cards received from the Sheboygan SAINTS and SURESHOTS dart ball teams for the use of the church as a home team dart ball location. Also, a donation to the church from the SAINTS team's fund.
