Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for February 2018 (Linda Mueller): Linda reviewed the reports.

Total Income: \$8,070. Total expense: \$11,268. Net Income: \$-3,199. Building Improvement Fund: \$36,407 Parsonage Fund: \$21,066. General Fund: \$5,356.

Memorial Fund Savings Account: \$69,916, plus Total Memorial Monies: \$1,975.

Other assets: 573 shares Heartland Financial: \$30,656. Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$7,608.

(Attendance was down from last year. Consensus was weather and lack of heat in the building).

Office Supplies and Expenses increased because we went over the number of copies allowed in the contract.

Adjusting what is being printed and not printing in color unless necessary.

Garbage pickup has increased \$3 per month.

Both the VBS and Sunday School checking accounts, totaling \$4,515, have been closed out. Looking to add this as a separate item in the report.

Head Trustee Report (Mason White):

Boiler went out again on 2/7/18. TJ got it working again. It heats 80% of our building. Need to look at replacing it. Warner & TJ working up numbers and options for replacement.

Sump pump under elevator burnt out. Had to replace sump pump. Big thank you to John Brown.

Elevator yearly cost for inspections \$4,038 is coming due. John Brown checking on options and contracts.

Carpets in Fellowship hall and hallways completed and looks good.
