Total Income: \$9,634. Total expenses: \$12,254. Net Income: \$-22,901.

Building Improvement Fund: \$21,346. Parsonage Fund: \$26,967. General Fund: \$-15,960.

Memorial Fund Savings Account: \$102,091. Plus, Total Memorial Monies: \$-18,330

Other assets: None. Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$9,246. (Attendance was up from last year.)

Memorial Fund Savings – Sound system was paid out but have not transferred funds.

Parsonage – Have not heard from John. Need to decide if we want to extend this again. Discuss next month. Little over on the Year to Date Budget, we paid \$3,064 for insurance.
