Advent is a season of preparation—a time of waiting and watching for the coming of Christ. One of the ways that I prepare myself for Christmas is through music. And while the planning for worship happens long before Advent begins, in our house, Christmas music does not begin until Thanksgiving is over—it's one of the few rules that I enforce with a passion. But once the leftovers are packed up, my Spotify playlist runs non-stop. And while I listen to a frustratingly wide variety of Christmas tunes, I want to share three that stick with me.

In a lesser known carol, "Infant Holy, Infant Lowly" we hear: *Infant holy, Infant lowly, For His bed a cattle stall; Oxen lowing, Little knowing Christ the Babe is Lord of all. Swift are winging Angels singing, Noels ringing, Tidings bringing, Christ the Babe is Lord of all.* 

In her poem set to music, "In the Bleak Mid-winter," Christiana Rossetti writes: *What* can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a Shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part. Yet what I can I give Him, Give my heart.

In the John Rutter carol, "What Sweeter Music," he writes: *What sweeter music can we bring, than a carol for to sing the birth of this our heavenly King?* 

In each of these three carols, we are invited into moments of humility and wonder. We are welcomed into the unfolding story of the birth of Christ. What are the Christmas songs that bring you closer to the story of the manger? I hope as this Advent season unfolds you will take the time to enjoy the small moments of wonder that are unfolding around you. I hope that the music that surrounds you fills you with hope, peace, love, and joy.
