November is the month where we focus on what we are thankful for, but sometimes we get bogged down in the moments that do not give us joy. We forget to count our blessings. We linger on our disappointments and failures, rather than being grateful for all the gifts that God gives to us.

During this year's stewardship drive we are going to be more intentional in counting our blessings, not for our own sake, but for the sake of the work God has called St. Paul's to be part of. By now you probably noticed that you do not have a Time and Talent form in your stewardship materials. This year we are going to try something a bit different. You will have found a pledge card for your time and you may be wondering what you ought to do with this. Some people in our church do jobs that are very visible, but many of you do the little jobs that can go unnoticed. The idea of the pledge card for time is to be able to understand how many hours are given in service of the church. Here some examples: If you ring in the bell choir or sing in the chancel choir, you donate something like five hours a month to the church; or if you help prepare and serve refreshments, you've donated an hour. There are so many ways people can share their gifts with the church that you might not even think of, like prayer. Everyone, regardless of where you are in your faith journey, can pray for people. If you spend ten minutes a day in prayer, you've given an hour to the work of the church. Everyone can share this blessing, regardless if you are 5 or 95. So how will you give of yourself for the sake of the Kingdom of God?

You will also notice a display in the sanctuary. My hope is that each of you will make it a point to pledge some of your treasure to the work of St. Paul's. Regardless of the amount of your pledge, whether it be \$10 or \$10,000, you are invited to place a heart on the display. Together we will watch the larger heart fill will all of our hearts as we work toward providing a strong foundation for our work on behalf of the living Christ. We will see our blessings grow through our stewardship time.

So as you fill out your pledge cards, both financial and time, I encourage you to count your blessings and think how you might share your abundant gifts with St. Paul's. With all of us working together, we will proclaim that we have been redeemed, called, and claimed by the one who offers us grace upon grace, and love unending.
