Lent is upon us once again. Each year our Lenten journey takes us from the starkness of Ash Wednesday through the darkness of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday to the joy of Easter morning. Each year during Lent, I try to find a few things that help me experience my faith more deeply. One easy piece for me is attending midweek Lenten worship. While I usually have the pleasure of sharing worship on Wednesday nights with Mike King, Lent gives both of us a chance to share in worship with Rev. Whelton and the congregation at St. John's UCC. The past few years have been especially meaningful during the Lenten season to help me engage more deeply in my relationship with God.

This year's services will be a bit different than usual. While our men's choir will sing and Mike will help lead us in song, Rev. Whelton and I will be leading our congregations in some spiritual practices to deepen our faith together. We will be working through a collection of texts using ancient practices to help enhance and deepen our faith. Each week will try our hand at another practice that you can do on your own. We will explore sacred imagination, Lectio Divina, Havruta, PARDES, and Floralegium. Each practice will help you engage scripture differently and help you to think more deeply about how you engage sacred texts. I hope you will consider setting aside some time each Thursday night at 6:45 pm at St. John's UCC to dig a little deeper.

Another way to try something new is to join us for the Women's Guild Lenten breakfast series. Each year I am blessed to be able spend a few Wednesday mornings among friends to share in fellowship and a short Lenten meditation. If sharing a meal weren't enough, some dear friends of the church, Barb Hengst and Dale Miller, will share their gifts with us as they lead us in worship. I hope you will consider joining us for one of the Lenten breakfasts.

Reading books is a regular practice of mine to help me make sense of life. A short while back I came across book by Rob Bell called "What Is the Bible?" He writes:

Some people see the Bible as an outdated book of primitive, barbaric fairy tales that we have moved beyond. And so they ignore it, missing all of the progressive and enlightened ideas that first entered human history through the writers of the Bible—ideas and ideals we still fall far short of, ideas and ideals that are still way ahead of our present consciousness and practice.

And then there are the folks who talk about how important and central and inspired the Bible is but then butcher it with their stilted literalism and stifling interpretations, assuming that it says one thing and if you just get that one thing, then you've read it well.

But you, I want you to read the Bible in a whole new way.

This is a book about a library of books dealing with loss and anger and transcendence and worry and empire and money and fear and stress and joy and doubt and grace and healing, and who doesn't want to talk about those?

During the Lenten season, I invite you to join me in taking a peek at this book so that we might deepen our faith together in study. If your interested in joining in the study, please contact me or Lisa in the office.

No matter how you decide to journey though Lent this year, I hope this time helps deepen your faith and brings you closer to God.

**Review/approval of Secretary's Consistory Minutes (Steve Flook):** Copy of the Consistory Organizational Meeting after worship on January 27, 2019 were reviewed. Accepted. January monthly Consistory meeting minutes to review—tabled until the March meeting.

# Treasurer's Report & Stewardship Report for January 2019 (Greg Peterson):

Total Income: \$11,360. Total expenses: \$14,037. Net Income: \$-2,677. General Fund: \$-5,455. Building Improvement Fund: \$21,767. Parsonage Fund: \$109,510.

Memorial Fund: \$104,405. (Savings Account: \$101,522. Plus, Total Memorial Monies: \$2,883.) Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$9,467.

- \* Attendance this January was up 78 compared to January 2018
- \* Collections in January included another \$1,500.00 for Second Mile & another \$75 for cookbooks
- \* Greg stated we may want to discuss ways of shifting our investments (reallocating). A committee will be formed to come up with a new investment strategy for funds (excluding general fund).

# Head Trustee Report (Mason White):

- \* A few small plumbing issues to address. Dishwasher sink in kitchen was backing up.
- \* Edgewater Plumbing jetted out the drain due to a rusted out grease trap. Draining better now.
- \* Been busy with snow removal over the past month. Nearly 10 hours in just the past week.

# Board of Christian Education Report (Deb Severns):

- \* Spaghetti dinner is coming up March 24<sup>th</sup>
- \* Faye's Pizza fundraiser coming soon. Stay tuned for details in coming months.
- \* Cookbooks will be sold at the Miesfeld's brat fry in March along with the baked goods.
- \* Getting ready for the Easter Breakfast. Won't be setting up full place settings...will use good plates.

# Pastor's Report (Pastor Jeremy Hylen):

- \* New sound system is fully installed and has been receiving mostly positive comments.
- \* Currently looking into cost for loop packs and will report back.
- \* Daane Electric took a look at the lighting in our sanctuary and has found issues we may want to address in the future (not immediate)...light fixtures, light sockets & circuit breaker box updating.
- \* First Congregational may borrow us their lift to remove large speaker up above in front of sanctuary.
- \* Springdale Farms soup production has slowed. Will be using our kitchen, but not regularly.
- \* There will be a facility inspection on March 8 to look into approving us for licensing for an Adult Daycare Organization.
