

General Synod (GS) is the national gathering of the whole church which happens every two years in varying locations around the country. - 3 I can't tell you how much pride I have in our larger church with the way we gather and work together on hard issues (especially when we don't agree).
- 4 The community worship on June 23 had about 4000 participants (pictured below).

Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Report for April 2019 (Greg Peterson):

Total Income: \$12,473. Total expenses: \$10,454. Net Income: \$2,019.

Cash Balance: General Fund: \$ -11,156. Building Improvement Fund: \$23,821. Parsonage Fund: \$109,510. Memorial Fund: \$89,622. Sunday School \$8,598.

Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$9,974.

Attendance in April was 508 vs 424 prior year.

Giving was also up \$12,444 vs \$7,832 in prior year.

Year-to-date Net Income was -\$10,457 vs. budget of -\$15,814.

Head Trustee Report (Mason White):

Received a call from the asphalt company that did our lots. Offered to do any work at the same price. It was determined that we don't need any repairs at this time.

Board of Christian Education Report (Deb Severns):

Carnival went well. Had 135 kids and served over 200 hot dogs. Everyone liked the carnival indoors. Was also easier to keep the flow/direction of kids. Will do it indoors again next year. Will bring back the bouncy house and put in the front of the building. Donuts and popcorn were a big hit.

Sunday School start date is set for September 8th and kick off on the 15th. Classrooms are all set. **Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):**

Oil candles were purchased with memorial money.

Installation of new furnaces to be scheduled soon.

Office copier is being replaced.

UCC insurance sharing program ends December 31, 2019.

General Synod worship and street fair is June 23. Pastor will be there June 21-25. Mike King will cover for him on the 23rd. The worship is at 3 p.m.

Cabinet Meeting to be held on July 14th after the church service.

President's Report (John Brown):

Next Consistory Meeting is July 10th at 7 pm.

Next Communion Sunday July 14th.

Other Business:

Mike King contacted a guy regarding projector. Current one does not have enough power to do what we want. Need one with 7800 vs 4800.

Steve Flook said his parents at St. Marks are working with the program Re-member. This is a reservation that is very poor and have been devastated by flooding. His parents are gathering supplies, hygiene products, baby supplies and then delivering them. Collection happening up to the end of July. His parents would come and talk to our congregation. It was felt that St. Paul's could help. Steve will check with his parents.

Deb Severns said that the kids would like to go to a trampoline place. She questioned, can they take their own cars as transportation? Jeremy thought they would need 2 adults per car per the Safe Sanctuary. Will have to check on our insurance before Deb mentions this possibility to the kids.

RE-MEMBER - Pine Ridge Indian Reservation

Pine Ridge Indian Reservation (Oglala Lakota County, South Dakota) is the poorest county in the United States. Nearly 20,000 residents on the reservation suffered severe flood damage this spring. Many families lost everything in these floods. The assistance response from the state and federal was nonexistent for far too long. The United Church of Christ and the Wisconsin Conference have a long-standing relationship with Pine Ridge and Re-Member (the non-profit established to help Pine Ridge). Pat and Noreen Flook (from St. Mark's UCC in Cleveland) have organized and participated in multiple mission trips to Pine Ridge and will be returning in August. To that end, St. Paul's will be helping with a supply drive for their trip. Donations will be accepted until July 21, 2019.
