

Every two years, General Synod brings together thousands of faithful members of the United Church of Christ for formal church witness, inspirational worship, and fellowship with friends. A little more on General Synod in Milwaukee...

- 380 volunteers from 105 churches volunteered to help with a total of 3,355 volunteer hours.
- The General Synod raised over \$7,500 for Pathfinders, a Milwaukee non-profit working with the homeless population, in addition to providing resources to prepare 200 hygiene kits and arranging to donate all the furniture used for General Synod for their facilities.
- The Communion ware for the Community Worship on Sunday, June 23, was designed and made by Rev. Colleen Kwong (who handmade our communion ware). I bought a set especially for Midweek worship.

During our closing worship, the Rev. Amy Butler from Riverside Church in New York City proclaimed: "lift up your eyes. Don't look behind you. There's a new future dawning right ahead of you." Her message and that of the General Synod resonated with me, especially with where we are going as a congregation. While we know we stand on the shoulders of those saints who built up St. Paul's, we are embracing our future as a community of faith on the south side of Sheboygan. I am filled with hope of how St. Paul's will continue to grow into the community that God has called us to be. What a way to end General Synod…and what a way to move forward in our life together.
