Lent begins fairly late this year (Ash Wednesday isn't until February 26). Lent, as you recall, is a time for preparation for the coming of Easter. It lasts roughly six weeks from Ash Wednesday through Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and ending with the celebration of Easter. During this time of preparation, we change the paraments (clothes on altar, lectern and pulpit) to purple. During this time, we tend to focus on our inward self and our personal faith journey. We tend to think of Lent as a time of deprivation with ideas of penance, fasting, more intentional prayer. It never helps that Lent takes place in the dead of winter through February and March. But I'd like to help you reimagine lent for this year.

What if instead of letting the darkness of the season guide our Christian practices, we used this winter season to build and grow our faith with something more positive in mind. Recently I read a book called *The Little Book of Hygge: Danish Secrets to Happy Living* by Meik Wiking. He details the concept and practice of **Hygge** (pronounced who-ga). Hygge is a Danish word for a quality of coziness (feeling warm, comfortable, and safe) that comes from doing simple things such as lighting candles, baking, or spending time at home with your family (this is a defining characteristic of Danish culture). What if we spent this season of preparation for the coming celebration of new life in Easter being intentional of spending time with those who bring us life.

What I am suggesting starts in this way. Set aside time each week of Lent and take some time to enjoy your loved ones. I'll be the first to admit that this can be hard if you have a busy schedule (like most of us do). I'll also be the first to tell you that if you don't start planning now for Lent, it won't happen. Doing something like this will take planning, and most of all it will take sacrifice to make the time. Let's assume that you've just agreed to this proposal and are trying to figure out what do to. Here are a few ideas:

- * fix a meal together or gather around the table and enjoy a meal together
- * grab some popcorn and turn your living room into a theatre and enjoy a movie
- * take a hike in the winter air (or someplace warmer)
- * go out for a meal at your favorite restaurant (call it a date night!)
- * make a phone call to a loved one who isn't as close as you'd like
- * sit and read books together or do a puzzle
- * volunteer as a family somewhere that brings you joy

Whatever you do, do it together with those who bring you life. Leave the phones and thoughts of what comes next, and be fully present with those who remind you of the Easter message.

If we are truly preparing ourselves for Easter, the message of new life in Christ that overcomes our doubts, fears, and our own worst selves, we need to remind ourselves of all the ways Jesus led by example. And maybe we ought to try following that example this coming Lenten season.

Total Income: \$18,568. Total expenses: \$18,620. Net Income: \$-52.

Cash Balance: General Fund: \$ -4,512. Building Improvement Fund: \$20,160. Parsonage Fund: \$109,510. Memorial Fund: \$538,938. Sunday School \$6,313.

Stewardship Report Weekly Giving total: \$11,474.

Attendance was up from the previous year.

Some 2020 pledges were given in 2019 and will be deferred to 2020.

Second Mile giving was \$6,300. Up \$2,300 from the December budget.

Did receive \$727 for building usage from Spring Farms.

Church audit completed tonight and there were no issues.

Investment discussion on making sure our money is guaranteed. Andrew spoke with their insurance company and they will get a policy to insure our money.

Board of Christian Education Report (Deb Severns):

Blue Harbor event coming up. Cost \$15 per Swimmer and \$10 for non-swimmers. But CE will only be charging \$5 per person and picking up the remainder. Can have up to 100 attendees. No food will be served. Need to sign up no later than February 16. Must pay at the time of signing up.

Pastor's Report (Jeremy Hylen):

License and Inspection of the kitchen passed. Water sprayer by dishwasher needs to be repaired.

Easter falls on the second Sunday in April. Moving Communion to the 19th of April.

Purchased Nest thermostat to control the heating. TJ Brown will help to install them.

Wi-Fi installed and working throughout the building.

Purchased doorbell/entry camera. Waiting for weather to be installed.

Online doodle for mission trip to go out soon.

Organ issues - Lisa Flook working on getting an organ committee together. The piano in the choir room also has a broken key. The committee will also be looking into pianos since all are in bad shape.

Investment – Looking at updating the gathering area. Richard Reineking is getting prices. New carpet cost between five and six thousand dollars. Furniture between two and three thousand.

First United Lutheran just updated their kitchen to a full commercial kitchen. Jeremy has met with them. Our kitchen is not up to code, needs electrical, plumbing, grease traps just to name a few things. Currently we are grandfathered into a clause that if we don't make any changes, we are fine. But things are deteriorating and out of code. We need to start looking at what we want to do with the kitchen. There are two companies that deal with commercial kitchens. One out of Green Bay and one out of Milwaukee. The Pastor will get estimates and then an Ad hoc committee will be established.
