## **Board of Christian Education Report**

Many changes were made to Christian Education this year due to COVID-19. Sunday School stopped meeting in-person in April and, due to church closure, Confirmation was not able to proceed as normal in May. Confirmation was moved to the outside service on October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020 with two Confirmands (Kyle Flook and Brendan Severns) becoming our newest members. Twenty-two children received weekly lessons, activities, and messages during our Summer Sunday School session in July/August. Children were encouraged to join in one of two weekly half-hour Zoom meetings on Sunday afternoons (younger kids @ 4:30/youth @ 5:00). During the summer, Sunday School averaged eleven kids per week. Every child that participated in the weekly meeting received a "reward" that reinforced the prior week's message.

Fall Sunday School was like the summer platform but expanded to also include weekly trivia questions and printed worksheets. It began in mid-September and ran through December 20<sup>th</sup>. Fall Sunday School averaged twelve children per week. Children received treats, glowing cups/balloons and activities for a special

Halloween Party and Christmas bingo cards, treats and a family Advent book for a Christmas Party. Families met separately in church to record their parts for the Christmas play. Pastor Jeremy then combined the recordings into one piece and placed them online for viewing in December. CE created two Glad Tidings newsletters highlighting the positive things still taking place at church and served hot chocolate and cookies during drive-thru Communion in December. Stained Glass Advent Candles were handed out free to each family at St. Paul's and CE participated in the design, production, and delivery of the candles. Easter Breakfast/Egg Hunt, Spaghetti Dinner, Carnival, and Trunk or Treat events were put on hold in 2020 due to Covid.
